

FREE Courses in Maths and English

Our maths and English courses are a great way to build confidence, improve skills and get a nationally recognised qualification if you wish. Whatever your level, our experienced tutors will help you choose the best course to help you achieve your goals. You will work at your own pace, focusing on the skills you feel are most important to help you meet your personal and professional needs.

English: Improve your reading skills, practise basic spelling, punctuation and grammar, boost your spoken communication and learn how to write effectively for different purposes.

Maths: Learn and practise skills like calculating, measuring, and working with fractions, decimals and percentages confidently. Learn how to apply your skills to maths in everyday situations.

Whether you want to simply boost your confidence, do a short coursework-based qualification, work towards a Functional Skills exam, or do all three - we have the course for you.

FREE Courses in Information Technology

We offer short, fun and interactive learning sessions that will support you to improve your employability, communication skills and confidence. Our courses range from learning how to search for jobs on the internet and complete online job applications through to how to use digital platforms, the internet and mobile devices, word processing, databases, spreadsheets, data management and IT security.

We can deliver ICT by distance learning, blended learning and classroom sessions whilst maintaining the safety of our learners in line with current government guidance.

Distance Learning - you will have access to weekly online tutorial sessions with your tutor and an online learning programme that is tailored to meet your learning needs. You will need access to a computer/laptop and the internet to complete these online distance learning programmes.

Adult Learning ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages)

If English isn't your first language, our courses will help you to develop your communication skills for everyday situations. You will have the opportunity to work with students from many different countries. You'll make new friends, boost your confidence, learn how to read, write and speak clearly in English.

We are able to offer classroom based courses whilst maintaining the safety of our learners in line with current government guidance. You will also be invited to join our weekly on-line conversation class to put your skills into practice.

You will be asked to complete a short assessment which will help us to place you on the right course. You will be asked to provide photo ID, proof of residence status in the UK/EU and any previous ESOL certificates you have. This helps to make the enrolment process easier.

A fee may apply subject to eligibility.

Supported Employment Programme

We run a series of courses aimed at broadening the skills and experiences of learners with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, with a view to improving their prospects and helping them gain employment.

Future Focus Life and Work Skills Programme - Learners with a range of abilities, including those with significant speech, language and communication difficulties will learn to express their opinions, and make realistic choices as they prepare for adulthood, whilst following the key themes of employment, independent living, health and community inclusion. Time in real community settings helps learners close the 'gap' between their aspirations and the skills, knowledge and experience that they already possess.

Supported Internships - A chance to develop skills and experience in an employment environment, with the offer of tailored support. This course aims to help young people move into sustainable, paid employment. Running across a full academic year, learners will take part in a personalised study programme during their time with the employer, with the option to gain relevant qualifications including English and maths. No formal qualifications are required.

Supported Internships are available for young people with an Education Health and Care Plan up to academic age 25.

Traineeships - Designed for those young people who want to work, but who need some extra help and support, we offer the training and work experience they need to develop their life and work skills, particularly their English, maths and ICT skills. This programme, which can be up to twelve months, is aimed at young people who have some qualifications below Level 3 (A Level) and who have a limited experience of work, but are likely to be ready to start paid work by the end of the programme. Traineeships are available to all young people aged 16 to 24.





Celebrating Success

Every year we take part in the Festival of Learning and hold an awards ceremony for our learners, tutors and partners.

One of the awards is Outstanding Apprentice of the Year which this year went to Emma Glenister.



Emma Glenister, 20 from Bishop Auckland started her learning journey last year after finishing her A Levels and has continued to grow in confidence since. Emma said; "After leaving school I had been working in a pub but really wanted to try an office job as I wasn't keen on going to university."

Emma started on the Level 3 Business and Administration course last February, which is 20% off the job training. Emma explained how she managed to juggle her time while working and studying. Emma said; "At the start I was worried how I would manage to fit in the time, as it is 20% off the job and managing the tests can be a challenge, but once I started it became easier and I had support from the tutors."

The apprenticeship has helped Emma to grow in confidence and given her the opportunity to think about her future and what she would really like to do.

Emma added "I feel like as a person I have grown a lot, I've learnt new skills that have helped build my working relations and confidence. Without the course I don't think I could have done as well in my job. I have found it bolstering to do the two together."

Emma is hoping to continue her studies and mentions that the course has given her the confidence to try other avenues. Emma said "The course has given me the confidence to think about university. I would like to study Business Management, and this is definitely something I will look into."



Course Fees

We do not charge for the following courses:

- Maths and English courses
- Information Technology classes
- Community Learning

Learners may be required to pay a fee for courses not listed above. The full fee is payable if a learner is under 60 and does not qualify for a concession. Learners who are over 60 on the first day of the course will qualify for a 25% reduction in fees.

Courses will be **free** if learners meet one of the criteria below:

- Aged 19 to 23 years and studying a first full level 2 qualification
- Aged 19 to 23 years old and do not already have a full level 2 qualification and need to study an entry-level or level 1 qualification in order to progress to level 2.

Your course may be fully funded if you are unemployed, in receipt of certain benefits, or earn less than £17,004.00 gross annual salary. Please call us for further details.

There is no Education Skills Funding Agency funding available for learners aged 19 and over undertaking a non-Apprenticeship learning aim at level 3 or above, delivered by our service. Learners must either take out a 19+ Advanced Learning Loan or fund the course privately.

We can offer assistance towards the cost of tuition, exam fees, travel, books, materials and childcare

If you are unemployed and in receipt of certain benefits and actively looking for employment, your course or exam fees may be subsidised.

Your fee makes a contribution to the cost of the programme. No fees will be charged to learners undertaking English and maths courses.

Advanced Learner Loans

If you are aged 19 or over and interested in studying at level 3 or above you may not need to pay course fees. Contact us for further information regarding an Advanced Learner Loan.

Spreading the cost of payments

You can pay in instalments for many of our courses. Ask your tutor for more information.

A full refund of course fees will be made if a class does not start or closes due to insufficient enrolments




